OVERVIEW

The enrollment of Red Rock Central Schools is currently 410 students PreK-12th Grade with an average of 35 graduating students per year. The Red Rock Central Agriculture Department is a single-teacher department that serves about 120 students per year in grades 7-12. Within the department, Rachel teaches classes such as: 7th grade introduction to agriculture, 8th grade exploratory agriculture, Wildlife and Fisheries, Agriculture Business, Crops and Soils, Welding, Food Science, Livestock Production, Small Animal Science, Vet Science and Flying SkyHigh with Drones.

Rachel's teaching philosophy is to educate students and consumers about where their food comes from. Overtime, this has taken on a new meaning and design for her, but continues to be the root of her main goal in teaching.
