Each year, the Pipestone agriculture department teaches approximately 300 students through a variety of courses covering numerous areas of interest for 6th through 12th grade students. These classes cover all the career pathways. Knowing the backgrounds of our students, the ag program offers classes ranging from the introductory level exploring agriculture I and II to ninth grade students covering all agriculture career pathways to advanced level options such as Agronomy. A key component to the program is the middle school exploratory classes in 6th, 7th, and 8th grade that ignites their interest in agriculture. The Pipestone Ag Program offers 25 different course offerings.
